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<sup>1</sup> The remaining cases cannot be announced immediately for a variety of reasons. The Archdiocese referred all of its cases to the local district attorney. A handful of cases have not yet been cleared by law enforcement so the internal Archdiocesan investigation led by the Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) has not begun. A few cases were just recently released by law enforcement and are currently under investigation by the MDT. In other cases, the Archdiocese has received clearance, the internal investigation is complete, and the matter is awaiting examination by the Archdiocesan Review Board or a final decision by Archbishop Chaput.

<sup>2</sup> Father Hoy died on July 25, 2011 before a full investigation could be conducted. Therefore, it was not possible to reach a final conclusion.
