Hearing God's Word OF HOPE AND ENCOURAGEMENT



In the following pages, you will find Scripture passages through which God reveals his promise of grace, healing and restoration. We recommend using the Church's ancient practice of *Lectio Divina*, outlined on the next page, to pray with these passages and allow God to speak personally to your heart.



How to Pray Lectio Divina

Lectio Divina, or "Divine Reading," refers specifically to an approach to prayer and scripture reading practiced by monastics since the early Church. The idea of praying with sacred scripture comes to the Church through ancient Jewish tradition. Christians in the early Church continued this tradition and further developed the practice of prayer and meditation using mostly the psalms as a rich source of heartfelt engagement with God. This development is evident in early Church History in the 48th chapter of the Rule of St. Benedict (A.D. 480-453).

Open your time of prayer by invoking the Holy Spirit. You can do this using your own words or you can pray the traditional prayer, *Come*, *Holy Spirit*:

"Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created, and you shall renew the face of the earth. O God, who, by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy his consolations. Through the same Christ Our Lord. Amen."

STEP 1: LECTIO

An attentive, slow, repetitious recitation of a short passage of scripture

In this first step, read the selected Scripture passage slowly and intentionally. Use your imagination to place yourself into the story. What do you see and feel? What are you experiencing? Take some time to pause and silently reflect on the experience. You may want to write down your reflections.

STEP 2: MEDITATIO

An effort to understand the passage and apply it to my own life

Read the passage slowly again. Pay attention to the word or phrase that stands out to you as you read. You may want to underline or circle it. How is God speaking to you in this word or phrase? Take some time again in silence to reflect and write down your thoughts.

STEP 3: ORATIO

Engaging or talking with God about the passage

Read the passage slowly once again and let the words be your prayer back to God. Then, write your own prayer to the Father in response to what He has been saying to you through this passage.

STEP 4: CONTEMPLATIO

Resting in God

Read the passage slowly one final time. Listen to the words and simply rest in the love of God in silence. You may want to end your *Lectio Diving* with your own prayer of praise and thanksgiving followed by an Our Father, Hail Mary and a Glory Be.

SCRIPTURE PASSAGES

When the LORD brought back the captives of Zion, we were like men dreaming. Then our mouth was filled with laughter, and our tongue with rejoicing.

The LORD is my shepherd; there is nothing I lack. In green pastures he makes me lie down; to still waters he leads me; he restores my soul.

He guides me along right paths for the sake of his name. Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff comfort me.

You set a table before me in front of my enemies; You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. She felt in her body that she was healed of her affliction. Jesus, aware at once that power had gone out from him, turned around in the crowd and asked, "Who has touched my clothes?" But his disciples said to him, "You see how the crowd is pressing upon you, and yet you ask, 'Who touched me?'" And he looked around to see who had done it. The woman, realizing what had happened to her, approached in fear and trembling. She fell down before Jesus and told him the whole truth. He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction."
