

JUBILEE YEAR 2025 IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF PHILADELPHIA *PILGRIMS OF HOPE*

The Jubilee Year was announced by Pope Francis on May 9, 2024, with the Bull of Indiction, *Spes non confundit* (Hope does not disappoint).

PRINCIPAL ARCHDIOCESAN CELEBRATIONS

Archdiocesan Opening of the Jubilee Year is December 29, 2024, Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph at the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul, at the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass Archbishop Nelson J. Perez, Celebrant and Homilist

All priests are welcome to concelebrate. Please vest in the Cathedral Chapel by 10:45 AM in the archdiocesan vestment.

Representatives of every parish, institution and religious community are invited to come as pilgrims of hope and then return with the message of the Jubilee year to spread throughout the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.

All will gather for this Mass in Sister Cities Park across the street from the main entrance to the Cathedral Basilica. A ceremonial cross will lead the "Pilgrims of Hope" to the main entrance of the Cathedral Basilica at which point the Archbishop will invite all to venerate it. This is followed by a commemoration of Baptism. The ceremonial cross will be placed in the Cathedral Basilica all throughout the Jubilee Year.

Archdiocesan Closing of the Jubilee Year is December 28, 2025, Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, at the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul, at the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass Archbishop Nelson J. Perez, Celebrant and Homilist

Please note: the only Holy Doors for this Jubilee will be in Rome.

Carlo Acutis at Malvern Retreat House, Malvern St. Gianna Beretta Molla at Nativity of Our Lord Church, Warminster St. Jude at St. Jude Church, Chalfont St. Katharine Drexel at the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul, Philadelphia Miraculous Medal Basilica, Philadelphia Padre Pio at St. Bede Church, Holland

• To the places of Baptism

The clergy and faithful are encouraged to visit the font of their Baptism, where their pilgrimage of hope began as Christians.

• To the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC

This pilgrimage will be scheduled for a weekday during the Jubilee to allow for greater participation of clergy and students in all the schools in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.

• RENEWED DEVOTION TO THE MOST HOLY EUCHARIST, ESPECIALLY WITH THE ANNUAL FORTY HOURS DEVOTION IN EACH PARISH, INSTITUTION AND RELIGIOUS COMMUNITY

- Each parish, institution including high schools, colleges and universities and religious community is strongly encouraged to observe the Forty Hours Devotion during the Jubilee Year. Dates that coincide with a parish or community feast, the anniversary of the dedication of the parish church or some other local significant date should direct the timing for this annual Eucharistic Devotion.

With the publication of the Jubilee Year Calendar of Forty Hours Devotion within the Archdiocese, the clergy and faithful will have many opportunities to participate in the devotion.

The 2024 edition of *Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharistic Mystery Outside Mass* provides the ritual guidance for this Eucharistic Devotion.

- Priests and deacons are encouraged to make use of the following themes when preaching the Forty Hours. These are themes for the Jubilee Year provided by Pope Francis in the Bull of Indiction:
 - Peace
 - Value of Human Life
 - Care for Prisoners
 - *Care for the Sick, Young People, Migrants, the Elderly (Grandparents)*
 - The Poor and the Forgiveness of Debts

• EMPHASIS ON THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE AND RECONCILIATION

- Everyone is encouraged to receive the gift of the Jubilee Indulgence at one of the Shrines in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.
- Deaneries are encouraged to publicize the various opportunities for the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation throughout the Deanery for the benefit of the clergy and faithful.
- Parishes, institutions and religious communities are encouraged to make use of the wide variety of options for communal celebrations of Penance as found in the 2023 *Order of Penance*, especially during Lent and Advent of the Jubilee Year.
- The Archdiocesan Missionaries of Mercy are available to assist with the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation all throughout the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. The Missionaries of Mercy and their contact information can be found on the Archdiocesan Jubilee Year website.
